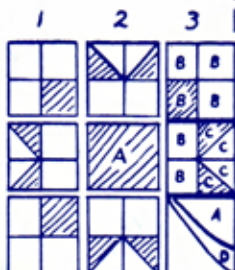

MAPLE LEAF QUILT

Sketch illustrates one full block and part of border. There are 28 pieced blocks set alternately with 28 white blocks each 12" square. There are seven blocks across and eight up and down.

Cut pieces -- the number and color given on patterns. Small sketch on "A" pattern illustrates easiest way to make the blocks. Sew pieces to form squares as shown in rows 1 and 2. Join squares as indicated by heavy lines in row 3, then seam 3 strips together.

There are three borders. For inside border, cut two strips of white for sides each 97" long and width of "B" piece and two strips for ends 85 $\frac{1}{2}$ " long. Next border is pieced -- the red "B" pieces alternating with the print "B" pieces. (There are 52 pieces down side of quilt counting corner pieces and 44 across not counting corners). Outside border -- cut two strips of white for sides each 103" and width of "B" piece and two strips for ends each 91 $\frac{1}{2}$ " long. Seam borders in respective order to quilt.

Plain squares may be cross-quilted or use feather circle. Line, pad and quilt. Bind in color.
