

Using the chart to make the pattern for Nosey, mark off 1-inch squares using the same number of squares as in the chart. Mark lines of pattern in same position in large squares as they appear in small squares of chart. Be sure to mark all numbers indicated on pattern in correct position.

Felt is recommended for Nosey but other materials such as flannel, percale, broadcloth or terry cloth may be used. Use strips of nylon hose, foam rubber clippings, cotton batting or kapok for stuffing.

If felt is used, sew insides of pieces together. If material is used, sew right sides of pieces together.

Clip and turn.

Seam center front of face pieces together.

Sew two teeth pieces together, making opposites. Pin teeth in place as indicated on face pattern. Sew mouth in place overlapping teeth.

Sew nose pieces together, leaving flat end open. Stuff the nose and insert a 8-inch piece of wire. Bend the end of the wire back to prevent wire from protruding through the fabric. Sew the nose in position.

Sew the pupil to white of eye in position indicated. Pin eyes in position on face and sew.

Match 3's on face and 3's on body front and sew together across neck.

Match 2's on body back and 2's on body inset and sew together around body.

Match 2's of body inset and 2's of body front. Sew together around body and continue around head. Leave a 3-inch opening at bottom of front body where legs are inserted.

Sew top of feet together, leaving open at top as indicated and area at bottom where soles are sewn. Sew soles to feet and stuff.

Sew arms together and stuff.

Stuff body. Insert a 7-inch piece of wire into head, neck and body. Bend ends of wire back the same as for the nose.

Insert legs in position and sew bottom of body together.

Attach arms in position.

In stuffing Nosey, use small pieces of batting or other stuffing first to fill small points. Push into place with wooden skewer, knitting needle, or blunt end of pencil before filling larger spaces.
